National School of Drama

National School of Drama (NSD) one of the foremost theatre institutions in the world and the only one of its kind in India was set up by Sangeet Natak Akademi in 1959. Later in 1975, it became an autonomous organization, totally Financed by Department of Culture, GoI. The objective of the NSD is to develop suitable patterns of teaching in all branches of drama both at undergraduate and post-graduate levels so as to establish high standards of theatre education in India. NSD Delhi offers a 3-three year duration of theatre training after graduation. Under consolidation of its Outreach programme, the NSD has set-up three centres at Agartala, Bengaluru and Sikkim to impart teaching & training in Dramatic Arts of one year's duration.

The School has a performing wing i.e. a Repertory Company to establish professional theatre and regular experimental work. The NSD has been promoting childrens' theatre through its performing wing named as Theatre-in-Education Company (renamed as Sanskaar Rang Toli) which was founded in 1989 and has been actively involved in production of plays for children, organizing summer theatre workshops in the schools of Delhi and also promoting childrens' theatre through Saturday / Sunday Club. Since 1998, the School has been organizing International Theatre Festival of India in which outstanding productions of theatre groups from within the country as well as abroad are being showcased for public at large during the month of February.

A short-term teaching and training programme titled 'Extension Programme' was started in 1978 under which the School in collaboration with the local theatre groups/artists organizes workshops on various aspects of theatre for benefit of theatre enthusiasts in various parts of the country ranging from 15-90 days and these programmes are invariably held in the local languages. The workshops could be broadly divided under three categories viz production oriented workshop, production oriented childrens' workshops and teaching and training programmes in Theatre. The School also publishes textbooks on theatre and also arranges for translation of important books on theatre from English to Hindi.

For the development of Theatre in the North East Region i.e. in 8 states in the North East, the NSD organizes various theatre workshops, theatre festivals of the plays mounted by theatre directors of the North-East region, showcases their plays in other parts of the country outside N.E.

Under a new Scheme of the GoI titled Tribal Sub-Plan, NSD has been organizing a lot of theatre activities for the promotion and preservation of tribals of the country and their varied art forms including organising of tribal festivals - Adirang Mahotsav - A National Tribal Festival of Dance, Music, Theatre and Crafts at various tribals dominated places.

Under Cultural Exchange Programme of the MoC, NSD visits foreign countries along with its productions / students / faculty to participate in conference / festivals organized in those countries. Similarly NSD invites delegations / productions of foreign drama schools.

Training at the National School of Drama

The National School of Drama provides a three year full time post-graduate diploma course in dramatic arts.

Aims

The central aim of the course is to prepare students for the practice of theatre. To this end, a variety of practical skills must be developed and a corpus of knowledge acquired. While all areas of study are assessed separately and a high standard of work demanded in each, the most important objective of the course is the development of the intangible concept of creative imagination and its expression within the collective framework of a group.

Subjects of Study

Modern Indian Drama

- Development of modern Indian Theatre from the mid-19th century with an emphasis on the contemporary theatre scene.
- Regional language theatre: theory and practice.

Classical Indian Drama & Aesthetics

• Understanding of Indian aesthetics, history of Sanskrit drama, detailed analysis of select Sanskrit plays and interpretation of the Natyashastra in terms of its dramatic structure, its performance and audience in the ancient period and its significance to contemporary theatre.

World Drama

• Study of major critical theories of theatre and application of these to written and performance texts from different periods of history. The primary focus is on European theatre with cross reference of Asian, African, American and Australian theatre.

Voice & Speech

• Exercise in speech to achieve breath control, clarity and audibility. The aim is to create modulation and range in voice and speech for the stage and enable students to perform a variety of roles with ease.

Yoga

• Through the practice of asans, kriyas and pranayam, Yoga aims at physical fitness, an increased degree of alertness, grace and concentration, and the full use of voice capabilities and breathing.

Movement

- Modern movement trends in theory, practice and their pioneers.
- Learning the principles of Shilpashastra and Natyashastra.
- Expressions of human experience and activities through the mind and through the body language such as gesture, postures and movements.
- Abhinaya (traditional acting principles of India) through physiological observation and expressions of persons, objects and scenic properties.

Theatre Music

• Aims at enhancing the sensibility of music in students through the knowledge of various sounds and rhythmic patterns and evolving it from the dictates of the play and their own environments.



• Inculcating a sense of stage music in aesthetic terms and as a 'Total Theatre' concept based on theatrespecific uses.

Acting and Improvisation

- Drawing out, moulding and refining each individual talent by shaping the actors' bodies and voices, sharpening their imaginations and sensitivities and tapping their emotional resources.
- Enhancing the awareness of the environment and experiences, and laying a foundation of techniques and skills in acting.
- Placing the major codified theories and methods of acting at the disposal of students.

Theatre Architecture

- Development of theatre in East with special emphasis on theatre forms in the Natyashastra, in South-East Asia, China and Japan.
- Contemporary theatre architecture and stage design in the East especially portable and fixed open-air-theatres and other architectural conventions suited to Indian conditions.
- Evolution of theatre forms and stage designs in the West from the Greek to the Modern periods.
- Scenic Design & Stage Technology
- Concepts and philosophy behind design.
- Ideas and methods of stage designers.
- Stage construction and stage techniques.
- Basics of set-design and making models.

Costume Design

• History of costumes, interpretation and style.

Stage Lighting

- Objectives of lighting
- Lighting plan
- Lighting equipment
- Elementary study of electricity and handling of the switchboard

Production Process

- Techniques and sensibilities for developing a theatre language
- Developing imagination by making small 'etudes/studies' involving music, props, sets and lights.
- Developing and understanding the structure of plays.

Appreciation Courses and Workshops

• Apart from the above courses, the School also organizes appreciation courses and workshop sessions on different aspects of Indian art and culture, sociology, philosophy and history for the students.



8th Theatre Olympics 2018


Background

National School of Drama (an Autonomous Institution under Ministry of Culture) organised **8th Theatre Olympics 2018** from 17th February to 8th April 2018. This was the 8th edition of the Theatre Olympics which had already happened in Greece, Japan, Russia, Turkey, South Korea, China and Poland in the past. Theatre Olympics is the event which attracts best Theatre Productions from all across the world and it also gives an opportunity to the Theatre lovers, practitioners, actors, playwrights and others associated with theatre to exchange their views and ideas for the growth of theatre activities in the world. The happening of this prestigious event was first announced by Dr. Mahesh Sharma, Minister of Culture, in a Press Conference held on 12th July, 2017.

National School of Drama Society constituted an Advisory Committee under the Chairmanship of the Chairman of NSD Society to supervise the overall organising of Theatre Olympics. Accordingly, various Committees were formed to plan and execute the event in detail.

The proposal of NSD for organising Theatre Olympics with an estimated budget of Rs. 51.81 crores was approved by Cabinet Secretary through Ministry of Finance, Deptt. of Expenditure vide their letter dated 18th September, 2018.

Efforts were made to reach out to theatre groups not only in India but across the globe requesting them to send best of their productions to participate in Theatre Olympics. It was also decided that all the eminent persons related to theatre should be associated with this prestigious event. Most of such personalities were invited to participate in the theatre festival with one of their best works. Theatre groups from abroad were also contacted through their embassies to participate in the theatre festival. Event was also publicized widely in Media in order to receive maximum theatre productions for showcasing during Theatre Olympics. Around 963 entries were received in the preliminary round for Theatre Olympics from India.





Around 109 productions were received under foreign category from following countries:-Pakistan, Afghanistan, Tajikistan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Kuwait, Poland, Australia, Austria, Japan, Norway, Spain, UK, USA, Russia, Germany, Singapore, Switzerland, France, Belgium, Greece, China, Israel, Turkey and many more.

These productions were scrutinised in two-tier screening process by eminent theatre experts drawn from all parts of the country. The Screening Committee recommended 377 productions in first stage under Indian category out of which 136 productions were selected and 80 entries under foreign category were recommended out of which 52 productions were selected to showcase in 8th Theatre Olympics 2018 in India.

National School of Drama Society had also decided to invite the productions of international renowned theatre Directors to showcase their productions in Theatre Olympics under the above category. Accordingly number of International eminent theatre Directors such as Mr. Theodoros Terzopoulos, Eugineo Barba, Romeo Castaluci, Nuria Espert, Antunes Filho, Tony Harrison, Yuri Lyubimov, Heiner Muller, Tadashi Suzuki, Robert Wilson and many more were invited with their productions.

The Theatre Olympics was organised not only in Delhi but in 16 other cities across the country. Theatre performance and allied activities were held in all these cities for the Theatre lovers, practitioners, students, scholars, academicians and others.

Akashwani and Doordarshan were Media Partners for publicity of 8th Theatre Olympics, 2018.

Inauguration

The Vice President of India Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu inaugurated the 8th Theatre Olympics 2018 in front of historic Red Fort in New Delhi on 17th February, 2018. The Minister of State for Culture (I/C) and Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Dr Mahesh Sharma, Shri Raghvendra Singh, Secretary MoC, Theodoros Terzopoulos, Chairman of International Committee of Theatre Olympics, Greece and a large number of dignitaries representing various fields of art and culture were present on the occasion.

The theme of the 8th Theatre Olympics was "Flag of Friendship" that aims to bridge borders and bring people of different cultures, beliefs and ideologies together through the medium of theatrical art.







It is also important to mention that Hon'ble President of India had invited the members of Theatre Olympics Committee and NSD organisers on 19th February, 2018 for meeting over tea and wish success for the event.

DELHI

Theatre performances had been planned from 18 Feb to 8th April, 2018 throughout the period of Theatre Olympics.

Performances were held in Abhimanch, Kamani, SRC, LTG and Open Air space of NSD Campus. 97 numbers of performances from India and 56 number of performances from foreign countries were held in Delhi. The response of public was over whelming and most the shows went houseful.



Academic Activities During 2017-18

The School provides a comprehensive 3 years course of training in Dramatic Arts. After the completion of the course, a Diploma in Dramatics is awarded to the successful candidates. In the 1st year, an integrated course of study is common to all students. It consists of courses in Dramatic Literature, Aesthetics, Theory and Practice of Acting including components of Mime and Movement, Martial Arts, Yoga and Music, Theory and Practice of Stage Techniques, such as Scenic Design, Costume Design, Lighting, Make-up and Theatre Architecture.

In the 2nd year, students have to opt for specialization either in Acting, Theatre Techniques & Design and Direction. The same specialization is continued in the 3rd year.

Admission: 2017 - 2020

In the first quarter of the year, National School of Drama released its Admission Notification in the selected newspapers of the country inviting applications from desirous candidates for admission to Three Year Post Graduate Course in Dramatic Arts for the academic session 2017-2020.

Fragmented, mutilated spatial and temporal memory in distress but nonetheless they try to sober them as much they can and set up to act out the fragments. It is farce and despair, two operative words that make our reality significant. The dead generation, waking up in a post-reality conforms that 'men make their own history'.

An-sky wrote the play after a three-year ethnographic study of the Jewish communities in south-east Russia, during which he documented a number of exorcism rituals carried out according to Jewish traditions and rituals of exorcism. In this adaptation this aspect of the original play is in the background, and the focus is on the plight of the two young people, and their fight for their love.





Technical Departments

Photography & Documentation Unit

Most of the student productions and those of the Repertory Company are videoed and photographed for archival purposes and are systematically preserved. Proceedings of workshops on important subjects of the training programmes for the students have also been videoed and photographed for use in future.

The School has acquired some of the finest still cameras and video systems for its Photography and Documentation Section. It is well-equipped with cameras, recording equipments, editing panels, display terminals and other sophisticated equipments.

Lighting Studio

A well-equipped lighting studio has been specially designed for training purposes.

Carpentry Workshop

An elaborate system for constructing sets and properties from a wide range of material has been established over the years. The Unit has skilled workers with the knowledge of set construction rare in the system of theatre training.

Costume Department

This Unit has preserved the costumes and properties of all plays produced by the students of the School, Repertory Company and TIE Company over the past 50 years. Every academic year, the School adds substantially to its collection of costumes and properties.

Property Department

This Unit has preserved the properties of all plays produced by the students of the School, Repertory Company and TIE Company over the past 50 years. Every academic year, the School adds substantially to its collection of properties.

Sound Studio

For recording music, lectures and performances, a well-equipped sound studio fitted with recorders, mixers, full-track tape recorders, microphones and speakers, and manned by qualified technical staff, has been made available to students of the School, the Repertory Company and the TIE Company.



Library

ACQUISITIONS:

The School library is one of the most specialized libraries in the field of theatre and Drama. The National School of Drama library acquires whatever material is available on dramatics in the Delhi market. Efforts are also made to secure plays and their criticism from outside Delhi and Abroad. It collects the material mainly on dramatics and related fields.

The subjects covered under the dramatics are:-



The Repertory Company is the regular performing wing of the School. It was set up in 1964 with only four actors with the dual purpose of establishing professional theatre on the one hand and continuing with regular experimental work on the other hand.

In 1964, late Shri Om Shivpuri led the Company and in 1977, the Repertory Company became a full-fledged unit inducting eight new artistes on its regular staff. Late Sh. Manohar Singh, a stalwart of theatre and cinema was the first Chief of the Repertory Company.

Growth

Besides staging plays in Delhi on a regular basis, the Repertory Company also undertakes performance tours to different parts of the country and abroad.

The Company is currently headed by Sh. Suresh Sharma and comprises a group of 20 regular artistes. These artistes are assisted by a number of casual artistes who are mostly passed out Graduates of the School and a team of administrative and technical staff. Over the years, the Repertory Company has produced a variety of plays ranging from stylized musicals to realistic contemporary Indian drama to translations and adaptations of foreign plays. Many artistes of the Repertory Company have emerged as celebrities in theatre, cinema and television.

The Company has toured extensively all over India and has made several successful trips to Germany, Poland, Britain, Nepal, Mauritius, China and Bangladesh in the past.




New Play

Bayen

'Bayen' - based on a story by Mahashweta Devi, Bayen is that play which creates awareness about the core expression of her writing i.e. socio-economic disparities and the different shades of human life. The play makes a constant effort to show how Chandi, a woman who has to pay the painful price of superstition to the extent of being deprived even of motherhood, also loses the seed of her own consciousness. And that pain and that seed are shat being strength and fertility to thousands of mothers as Chandi and takes them to the principle of their bravery. Finally, her son Bhagirath emerges as the symbol or representative of change in the young generation and is able to ignite the spark of self-respect and dignity.

Genesis

Even though there may be innumerable children in the country who are endowed with the spirit of performing theatre and fired with a passion for the dramatic arts, there is no institution available to impart formal theatre training to them and to fulfill their aspirations in this area. In these circumstances, the promotion of theatre amongst children of different age group with the aim of meeting their developmental, educational and creative needs has become an essential target for NSD. It was with this objective that a theatre company consisting of a group of actors/ teachers working with and performing for children in a regular basis was established on October 16, 1989. The company was named as Theatre - in - Education Company and was later renamed as the 'Sanskaar 'Rang Toli'.

Extension Programme

The National School of Drama provides a 3- year integrated training to its students. The annual intake of students in the course is limited, whereas the number of applicants runs into hundreds. Due to obvious constraints, a vast majority of theatre artistes in various States and with diverse languages and cultural backgrounds cannot be benefited by the facilities provided by NSD. To reach these theatre workers and also to create theatre awareness all over India, NSD established a short-term teaching and training programme titled 'Extension Programme' in the local languages in 1978. As a part of this programme, production oriented theatre workshops, production oriented children's workshops, design technical theatre workshop, teaching and training programmes in theatre, etc. are organized in collaboration with local agencies. Extensive efforts have been made to make this programme as broad-based as possible, with a view to reach all regions of the country, particularly those that are remote and backward.

Highlights 2017-18

- Rashtriya Poorvottar Rang Utsav was organized by NSD from 26th October to 3rd Nov.2017 at Guwahati, Tezpur and Jorhat (Assam) in which five plays from different parts of the country participated in each of the festival. Similarly, plays of the NER were also organized in other cities except NER.
- NSD's TIE Company organized the 'International Bal Sangam' festival of children from 3rd to 7th Nov. 2017 in Delhi. Around 250 child artists participated in the festival.
- National School of Drama in collaboration with Department of Art & Culture, Govt. of Odisha and District Administration of Keonjhar District organized the 1st National Tribal Festival of Theatre, Dance, Music and Crafts at Kendujhargarh (Keonjhar) Odisha from 17th to 19th November 2017. More than 19 states of the country participated in the festival. A Craft Mela was also organized during the festival period in which more than 50 craftsmen participated.



The audience also witnessed for the first time such event that represented the culture of the tribes from various corners of the country. The festival was highly appreciated by media.

8th Theatre Olympics 2018

NSD organised the 8th edition of the Theatre Olympics from 17th February to 8th April 2018 in Delhi and other 16 major cities. More than 450 plays from within the country and abroad were invited in the Theatre Olympics. The Vice President of India, Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu inaugurated the 8th Theatre Olympics 2018 in front of historic Red Fort in New Delhi on 17th February, 2018. The Minister of State for Culture (I/C) and Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Dr Mahesh Sharma, Shri Raghvendra Singh, Secretary MoC, Theodoros Terzopoulos, Chairman of International Committee of Theatre Olympics, Greece and a large number of dignitaries representing various fields of art and culture were present on the occasion. The theme of the 8th Theatre Olympics was "Flag of Friendship" that aims to bridge borders and bring people of different cultures, beliefs and ideologies together through the medium of theatrical art.

Many programmes such as Ambience performance, living legend series, seminar, workshops, face to face interaction were organised on the campus. Many important discussions on various issues relating to theatre were discussed, debated and deliberated by the eminent academicians and experts. "ADVITIYA - Youth Forum" in all the 17cities of 8th Theatre Olympics 2018 in India. They organizes street plays and theatre folk bands under ADVITIYA and more than 200 street plays from colleges and amateur theatre groups had been performed. Apart from this, there were two other competitions, i.e. 'short play writing' and 'be a reporter' have also been introduced for the first time and was opened to all the youth of India under the age of 35 years.

51 days long, the historic event was culminated in Mumbai on 8th April, 2018. The Chief Minister of Maharashtra, Shri Devendra Fadnavis was the Chief Guest at the closing ceremony. Union Minister of State (Independent Charge), Ministry of Culture, Dr. Mahesh Sharma and eminent theatre and film personality Shri Nana Patekar were Guests of Honour. The grand celebration of culmination of 8th Theatre Olympics 2018 came to an end with 'Rang Shikhar', a vibrant collage of more than 400 artists from tribal, folk and Modern theatre.



NSD Bengaluru Centre

National School of Drama New Delhi expanded its activities when it set up Regional Resource Centre in Bangalore. The Bangalore Centre has since evolved in to a full-fledged centre by completing its fourth edition of 'One Year Intensive Course in Acting'.

The NSD Bengaluru centre has paid importance in giving a distinct style of acting skills to its students. The Bengaluru Centre syllabus is a result of an attempt in developing Indian method of acting by extracting the acting methods from the best of traditional and folk performing forms of the South India, attempting in creating complete and versatile actors. It has extracted the essence of acting mentioned in the Natyashastra from these powerful performing arts of south India and utilizing it in forming the modern actor using a very unique method of acting. Thus the Bengaluru Centre has developed a distinct and a unique style of teaching that is vastly different from its parent institution in New Delhi.

While the programme at the NSD Bengaluru Centre is based on the lines of the programme of the mother institution in New Delhi, the Bengaluru programme also particularly focuses on traditional South Indian folk art, theatre and theatre training. The one - year Intensive Course in Acting currently offered by the NSD Bengaluru Centre offers a great platform to students looking to hone their acting skills.

The essence of the classical, folk and the powerful ritual practices from the South Indian states of Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Andhra, Telangana and Lakshadweep are included as part of the training. This is a new attempt in understanding Indian theatre and thus laying new paths for the future of Indian Theatre.

The Centre has now started the construction of its own Residential & Admin Block at Kalagrama campus, NSD Bengaluru centre has now heading to its fifth batch (of full-time one year course). This year the centre has organized 8th Olympics theatre festival where total 23 teams have participated including both national and international. Centre has also begun to facilitate/showcase the vibrant theatre from the region to its students and theatre enthusiasts in the city of Bengaluru.

The Bengaluru Centre is also in process of starting a Three-year Diploma course, similar to NSD Delhi in the near future.

Students here at the centre, while learning and understanding of the world theatre, it also strives to understand our own methods and faculties of regional performances and its acting skills with a practical approach. While the first batch students had an experience to enact in a play and learn its production skills with the final class production, like "Siri", a play directed by renowned theatre director B. Jayashree.

Among many other forms in the course, regional theatrical forms like Yakshagana, Theyyam, Therukoothu, Koodiyattam are taught at the centre, and the students of second batch also performed plays like Manimekhalai, Neera Odapu in Veeragase form and a Sanskrit play Dhootha Ghatotkacha, as class room productions which were performed for public. Third batch

Followed by the fourth batch, performed a play named "Gullkayaaji" which has finished its 9 shows as of now and also had been to New Delhi to perform in Theatre Olympics. This batch have also got chance learn different folk forms like Dollukunita, Mallakhamba, Parai, Silambattam, Oggu Katha, Padayani, Koodiyattam etc. They have also got a chance to perform Bertolt Brecht's "The resistible rise of Arturo Ui" as a performance for their Voice and speech classes.

B. V KARANTH RANGA SANGEETA WORKSHOP

As Music, both instrumental and vocal are major sectors of drama school, all the students of the batch 2017 - 18 were sent to Mysore on a 5 day workshop, which was named B V Karanth Ranga Sangeetha workshop.



B V Karanth ji is one of the pioneers in the field of drama and music, and also served both National school of Drama in Delhi and Rangayana in Karnataka. His then students and colleagues who are still practicing in the field of drama and music have organized a 5 days' workshop involving various musical instruments and techniques in music, at Mysore Rangayana. This workshop involved various workshops, and seminars by pioneers in the field of drama, literature and music. One of the Major elements of the workshop was the screening of movies dissected by B V Karanth and world's renowned movies on music. The screenings were later concluded by discussions over the shown movies. The major objective of the workshop was to give amateur students of drama, the knowledge of music, sound and rhythm. The workshop was attended by students from different places like Rangayana Dharwad, Rangayana Mysore, and NSD Bengaluru etc. All these students from various places were clubbed together and divided into groups. Every group were assigned by one head and supportive team, who including with students have to compose and perform music (vocal / instrumental) on the 5th day of the workshop. In this process of composition the major objective also lies in teaching the style of B.V Karanth composition and working. Different guests from various places were invited to give seminars, who have also felt emotional in sharing their emotional memories with the students. On the last day, the day of performance, everyone presented music composed by their respective teams

Kolata is the traditional folk dance of the state of Karnataka, located in Southern India on the western coast. Unlike its North Indian counterpart Dandiya Ras, it comes in two forms. First, it is performed with colored sticks and usually involves both men and women dancing together. Second, very rigorous play of sticks only by men dancing to folk songs Sticks here are thick and hard to sustain strong play.

There are many types of Kolata, like jade (ja - day) Kolata which means plait Kolata. People here jumble themselves holding long scarves. These jumbling form a plate. There are many types of jade Kolata including fishtail.

Madhumagalu is back again in 2017-18 with 20 shows slated for December-January. The actors this time are a motley mix of the young and the old, with 20 actors belonging to the one-year diploma program of NSD's Bengaluru Centre headed by C. Basavalingaiah.

After the completion of the Statue, the abahisheka gets completed only after Gullakayajji pours the milk she brings for Bahubali. The story is narrated in folk form through Bhagavatamela, Yakshagana. Parai and Kalari theater art forms with the growing non violence around the world, the message of peace and non - violence finds place in everyone's hearts.



Resisted: the Rise of Onortho Urum Based on the original play the Resistible Rise of Arturo UI by Bertolt Brecht adapted and Direction by M K Shankar

Brecht wrote the play in 1941 when the US became directly involved in the Second World War and Hitler's Germany had unleashed a region of terror and genocide of horrendous proportion. On the surface, the play Brecht illustrates the working of the nexus between the underworld of Chicago and politicians and businessmen. At the deeper layer, however, he is attempting to show the rise of Hitler and fascism in Germany on the wave of an orchestrated nationalistic hate campaign against the Jews, nurtured through the falsehood and prevarications of Hitler's lieutenant and minister of propaganda, Paul Joseph Goebbels. He a refugee from Nazi Germany, Brecht speaks of the role of a suppliant and docile media, which helps stoke the flame of fear and hate, and does not feel any compunction in spreading falsehood.

Adapted for the Indian geography -and political-economy-Onortho Urum shadows events in Bombay of the nineties where the gangsters become powerful enough to influence political decisions. Urum, who has been out of action for a long time and is desperate, is encouraged to blackmail corporator and popular political figure Daggubati who has become a symbol of purity in public sphere. The economy is down and Daggubati fears for the future of his son. He has" Seen the evils that poverty that can bring: and is persuaded by the offer of majority shares in the dockyard owned by a now desperate Shindhe. One wrong step and the gangland comes baying for blood. The media, the judiciary and the opportunist business community are suborned one by one until Urum becomes the unchallenged power in the land. But there are ordinary people who surmount fear and are able to go beyond the call of filial emotion. Eventually, they gather and, after sustaining several murders and may them at the hands the lumpen, Urum is stopped in his tacks in the event, the ending is departure from Brecht's reportorial paradigm, in the hope that India is capable of resisting forces that seek to irreparably damage its socio-political fabric.
